

No prisons - no flights!

Against the normality of deportation
detention and deportations!!



On December 8, 2000, 17-year-old Arumugasamy Subramaniam took his own life in the Hannover-Langenhagen deportation prison. Only a few months earlier, in May 2000, the prison had been opened as Lower Saxony's central deportation center. Located directly at the airport in three buildings of a former barracks area, the location could not be more symbolic. People from Lower Saxony and, in administrative assistance, from other federal states are detained here in order to enforce their deportation.

On the occasion of the 21st anniversary of Arumugasamy Subramaniam's death we want to remember the victims of the inhumane deportation machinery and demand an end to deportation detention. We protest against the injustice and inhumanity of deportations.

We want to make clear that we oppose the German and European policy of isolation, exclusion and disenfranchisement and fight for a society based on solidarity in which the right to freedom of movement applies worldwide.
